## October Month of the Holy Rosary

October 7 is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. October is traditionally observed in the Catholic Church as the Month of the Rosary. The Rosary has been a powerful and fruitful prayer of Catholic people in times of trial and need. "The origins are traceable to the tender devotion to Jesus and Mary that arose in the 12<sup>th</sup> century, and to the desire to give the unlettered faithful closer participation in the liturgy." (Catholic Encyclopedia) Since then it has been and continues to be a popular form of vocal and meditation prayer of Catholic people. More recently some non-Catholics have adopted it as part of their prayer life. The mysteries of the Rosary present for our meditation significant events in the life of Jesus Christ and of the Blessed Virgin Mary. With the addition of the Luminous Mysteries by Pope John Paul II the mysteries of the Rosary now present us with 20 sacred events on which to reflect. If you pray the Rosary each day, individually or with your family, continue to do so; if you do not pray the Rosary, this Month of the Holy Rosary offers an invitation to begin the practice.

## Visiting Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament

St. John, in his gospel, tells how John the Baptist pointed out Jesus to Andrew and himself saying, "Look! There is the Lamb of God!" He (John) and Andrew followed Jesus who, on noticing them, asked, "What are you looking for?" They answered, "Where do you stay?" and Jesus invited them, "Come and see." We, Catholic people, know where Jesus stays - in the tabernacle of each Catholic church where the Eucharist is reserved. Any time we see a Catholic church we, like John and Andrew, can hear the invitation of the Lord, "Come and see". We can accept that invitation; we ought not be so busy, so hurried, that we cannot accept his invitation and visit our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. John tells us that he and Andrew accepted the invitation to "Come and see," and "stayed with him that day." (cf Jn 1:35 et seq.) We do not have to stay with Jesus all day. We can visit him and stay with him for a while, and we can do so just about anywhere in the world. "Come and taste the goodness of the Lord."

## Adoration of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist



We can visit and adore the Lord Jesus Christ any time we can access a Catholic Church. There is a standing invitation: "Come on in, the Lord is waiting." Unfortunately in some places our Catholic churches cannot now be safely left open beyond the times of Masses and devotions. Here, in our parish, we are blessed that our Corpus Christi church is open each day from morning to evening. Let us avail of the opportunity presented to come and adore, praise, thank, speak to and petition the Lord. # Church Restoration and Repair

**Queen of the Snows Church:** *Work completed:* Restoration and Repair work has been completed - reconstruction of supporting concrete piers; addition of three supporting concrete piers; removal of deteriorated sections of roof supporting and floor supporting beams and replacement with new beam sections; painting of reconstructed piers and repaired beams. Cost: \$

*Work to be done:* Construction of handicap access ramp and re-figuring of rest room to handicap access requirements - plans awaiting Placer County Building Department approval; work to begin on approval of plans. Contractor: Dennis Schlumpf (parishioner) and Associates.
