In the readings since Christmas, Jesus has been revealed as the new royal son of David and Son of God. He is sent to lead a new exodus that brings Israel out of captivity to the nations and brings all the nations to God.

As Moses led Israel from Egypt through the sea to give them God's law on Mount Sinai, Jesus too has passed through the waters in baptism. Now, in today's Gospel, He goes to the mountain to proclaim a new law—the law of His Kingdom.

The Beatitudes mark the fulfillment of God's covenant promise to Abraham—that through his descendants all the nations of the world would receive God's blessings.

Jesus is the son of Abraham (see Matthew 1:1). And through the wisdom He speaks today, He bestows the Father's blessings upon "the poor in spirit."

God has chosen to bless the weak and lowly, those foolish and despised in the eyes of the world, Paul says in today's Epistle. The poor in spirit are those who know that nothing they do can merit God's mercy and grace. These are the humble remnant in today's First Reading, taught to seek refuge in the name of the Lord.

The Beatitudes reveal the divine path and purpose for our lives. All our striving should be for these virtues—to be poor in spirit; meek and clean of heart; merciful and makers of peace; seekers of the righteousness that comes from living by the law of Kingdom.

The path the Lord sets before us today is one of trials and persecution. But He promises comfort in our mourning and a great reward.

The Kingdom we have inherited is no earthly territory but the promised land of heaven. It is Zion where the Lord reigns forever. And, as we sing in today's Psalm, its blessings are for those whose hope is in the Lord.

Sunday Readings and Backgrounds Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I : Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13 Seek justice. Seek humility.

- In the First Reading, Zephaniah announces that the humble of the earth will find shelter on the Day of the Lord.
- The prophet Zephaniah preached at a time of great turmoil.
- This reading asserts that the humble and lowly are the hope for the future.

Reading II : 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 God chose those whom the world considers absurd.

- In 1 Corinthians, Paul tries to convince the Corinthians that their significance comes from God, and that their power is the power of the cross.
- The Corinthians, who accepted the Gospel eagerly, then began to try to outdo each other in importance, even in their Christian faith.
- Paul challenges the Christian community to rely, not on human power, but on God alone.

Gospel : Matthew 5:1-12a The Beatitudes

- Today's Gospel begins the Sermon on the Mount, a collection of Jesus' sayings describing the qualities of his followers.
- The way righteousness is described in today's reading is through a traditional Hebrew form called Beatitude. Beatitudes simply declare that someone is happy or blest.
- The list in Matthew's Gospel is surprising, however. The poor and suffering were not ordinarily described as happy.

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What Are Beatitudes? What is Jesus offering us today? They are called the “Beatitudes”—but what do they mean? There

are no easy answers. Some say they are unattainable ideals, put before us as challenges. Others say they are only for a spiritual elite: the saints. Others would “translate” them into political slogans. One popular television personality called them the “Be Attitudes,” subtly presenting them as optimistic, vaguely New-Age ideas.

Was Jesus a “wimp”? Is he asking us in the Beatitudes to be weak? Is this a program for so-called “losers”? We must admit that our conceptions of “meek” and “gentle” rarely serve as ideals toward which many of us care to strive.

Jesus does not burden his disciples with a system that counsels us to grit our teeth and endure. Instead, he places us in the midst of the real world and its conflicts, and he promises us a reward. Righteousness will be satisfied and merciful action will result in mercy extended toward us. As with Zephaniah, Jesus links justice and humility. We must be pure in order to direct ourselves and help others. *Copyright © 2007, World Library Publications. All rights reserved*
