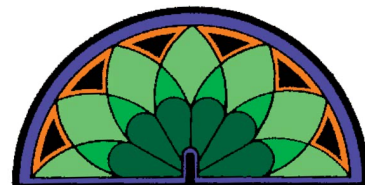


The Confirmation and First Communion classes are now in full swing. Please pray for them.

Sunday Readings and Backgrounds Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Reading I : Acts 10:34a, 37-43 God raised him up on the third day.

- In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter efficiently summarizes Jesus' life and death.
- Peter, whose denial of Jesus was heartrending, had now been given a new strength to tell the story of God's anointed one.
- The source of Peter's strength was his "witness"; he was one of the few who had been chosen "to eat and drink with Jesus after he rose from the dead". (Acts 10:41)

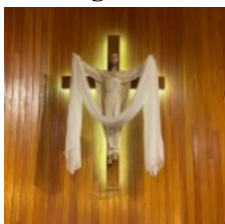
Reading II : Colossians 3:1-4 Set your heart on what pertains to higher realms.

- The two readings from the letter of Paul (we will use one or the other in our Liturgy of the Word) provide encouragement and insight to the newly baptized and to all Christians.
- The event of Baptism is a life-long journey that we renew every day.
- In both readings, Paul's point is clear: The Lamb of God has been sacrificed to give us fullness of life, and we must respond to that gift by the way we live our lives.

Gospel : John 20:1-9 Mary Magdalene came to the tomb.

- The Gospel reading is John's version of the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb.
- Central to the story is how the participants come to believe in the risen Lord.
- The disciples saw and believed, however the author calls attention to the "Beloved Disciple", who saw only the minimum yet believed. <https://lifelongcatechesis.osv.com/>

Becoming The Risen Christ Through the renewal of our baptismal promises we remember that in baptism we were joined to Christ's death and resurrection. What we can easily forget is that in baptism we were also joined to the life that Christ lived while on earth. We need not look too far to discover that the Lord Jesus came to call sinners to himself in order to share with them the wonderful gifts of forgiveness and salvation. Through our own baptism, we are called to imitate Christ. We are to let people know that, in and through Jesus Christ, true forgiveness and reconciliation are possible. As we lift heart and voice, singing the words of today's responsorial psalm, let us rejoice and be glad that in our baptism we have become the risen Christ for the world. *Copyright © 2007, World Library Publications.
