Jesus is portrayed in today's Gospel as a new and greater Moses.

Moses, the meekest man on earth, was God's friend. Only he knew God "face to face". And Moses gave Israel the yoke of the Law, through which God first revealed Himself and how we are to live.

Jesus, too, is meek and humble. But He is more than God's friend. He is the Son who alone knows the Father. He is more also than a lawgiver, presenting Himself today as the yoke of a new Law and as the revealed Wisdom of God.

As Wisdom, Jesus was present before creation as the firstborn of God, the Father and Lord of heaven and earth. And He gives knowledge of the holy things of the kingdom of God.

In the gracious will of the Father, Jesus reveals these things only to the "childlike"—those who humble themselves before Him as little children. These alone can recognize and receive Jesus as the just savior and meek king promised to daughter Zion, Israel, in today's First Reading.

We, too, are called to childlike faith in the Father's goodness as sons and daughters of the new kingdom, the Church.

We are to live by the Spirit we received in Baptism, putting to death our old ways of thinking and acting, as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle. Our "yoke" is to be His new law of love, by which we enter into the "rest" of His kingdom.

As we sing in today's Psalm, we joyously await the day when we will praise His name forever in the kingdom that lasts for all ages. This is the sabbath rest promised by Jesus—the rest first anticipated by Moses, but which still awaits the people of God.

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~Sunday Readings and Gospel~

Reading I : Zechariah 9:9-10 Shout for joy! He comes in peace!

- The verses in the reading from Zechariah describe the messianic king in terms familiar to the tradition.
- Jerusalem was personified as a sentinel waiting for the king's arrival.
- The new messiah, who came like Solomon, would banish all instruments of war; his kingdom would be a kingdom of peace.

Reading II : Romans 8:9, 11-13 Live by the Spirit.

- The Letter to the Romans describes the activity of God's Spirit.
- Paul uses the image of flesh without spirit to describe the person who does not live by God's Spirit.
- According to Paul, that "Spirit-less" person is already dead.

Gospel : Matthew 11:25-30 Come to me all you who are weary.

- In the Gospel today, Jesus speaks, not only as a wisdom teacher, but as Wisdom herself.
  - Jesus borrows the language of wisdom to praise God for revelation through him.
  - He is the perfect revelation of God because Jesus is God's Son, knowing God perfectly. <https://lifelongcatechesis.osv.com/>

**Theme:** Jesus refreshes and strengthens us for ministry.

Question for Children: When you are generous, honest, and loving, how do you know it is Jesus who helps you do that

Question for Youth: Jesus invites us to bring him our burdens and promises us that he will give us rest. How do you rely on Jesus during times of trouble? When has Jesus helped you?

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**We Are Not Debtors** Our King comes, not in the glory of earthly rulers, but as a humble poor man. Jesus tells us how God works in the world. Paul reminds us that we are not debtors to the flesh, but we are free people, liberated to be our best selves, to serve God and each other with humility and joy.

How do we live out this freedom of ours? Many of the world's poor live in severe poverty, their nations' economies weighed down by the yoke and burden of debt. This crushing debt is owed to the wealthy countries of the world, their banks and their investors. Our affluence rests in some measure on the back-breaking poverty of our brothers and sisters.

It is good to contemplate what we can do to relieve or forgive these debts that have been paid many times over, because interest payments are counted first. 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**You Will Find Rest** The promise of Jesus is good news indeed. God has hidden the knowledge of the reign of God from the learned and the wise, those who say that the poor are responsible for their own plight, and that nothing can be done for them. Jesus turns such human wisdom on its head, proclaiming instead that God works differently. We are poor in spirit if we follow Jesus in lifting the yoke of the law and slavery to the flesh, freeing the burdened of their crushing load. It may cost our economy some of its profits, but we can believe that our burdens will also be lifted and our work made light. What seems impossible to the learned is known to the humble. When we rest in Christ, laying down the burden of our preoccupation with "things," we can rejoice with all people at the coming of our meek and humble Lord, who brings holy rest to an anxious and materialistic world. *Copyright © 2007, World Library Publications.
